Preparing Your Condo for Your Absence

The following checklist are things to consider when leaving your condo unattended:

1 Turn off the condo's water at the water shut off valve.
2 Turn off the breaker switch in your breaker box for the hot water
heater.
3 Set your A/C's thermostat (to mitigate humidity and mold growth,
never completely shut down your condo's A/C). The following guidance is from
Florida Power and Light:
Manual thermostat: set to 77 degrees for condos. If you set your
humidistat to Relative Humidity of 58% you have greater flexibility and can set
your thermostat as high as 88 degrees.
Programmable thermostat: FPL recommends programming
thermostats at 72 degrees for two hours each morning before sunrise and as high
as 88 degrees the rest of the time. This prevents mold by removing moisture
from the air during the cooler hours when your A/C runs most efficiently.
4 Bring everything from balconies into your condo. Note this is
mandatory policy during hurricane season, June 1st through
November 30th. Consider stuffing "swim noodles" and "5/8-inch backer rod"
insulation into the spaces of your sliding glass doors to prevent high wind water
incursion.
5 Ensure all perishable goods are emptied from your refrigerator and
turn off the ice maker.
6 Empty all garbage cans and recyclables.
7 Stop or forward mail with the post office. For snowbirds, it is always a
good idea to ensure the Building Manager has your mailing address preference
for important OCNCA Ltc. mailings.
8 Stop newspaper delivery or arrange for a neighbor to pick up.
9 Consider leaving a key with a trusted neighbor to periodically spot
check the inside of your condo.
10 If you have purchased additional AT&T channels or internet speeds,
consider calling to cancel your upgrades at no charge to save money. Our bulk
