

Cloverleaf North Condominium Association, Inc. Hurricane Plan

Oceans Cloverleaf North has a generator that serves the common areas only if power is lost. It will not power your individual units. Everyone is invited to the social room when there is a power outage. Make sure it's safe to leave your condo.

Tropical Storm Watch: Issued when a tropical storm containing winds of 39 to 73 mph or higher is *possible*, generally within 48 hours.

Tropical Storm Warning: Issued when sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph or higher associated with a tropical storm are **expected** in 36 hours or less.

Hurricane Watch: Issued when hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or higher) are *possible*, generally within 48 hours.

Hurricane Warning: Issued to indicate that hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or higher) are *expected* in 36 hours or less.

PREPARATION BEFORE HURRICANE SEASON (before June 1)

- Stock up on bottled water, batteries, canned food, protein bars, milk that doesn't require refrigeration, cereal, and other non-perishable food and drinks (pet & baby food)
- Have flashlights, battery operated lamps, a battery-operated weather radio, battery packs or solar chargers for cell phones, tablets and other devices that require power.
- Have a City of Daytona Beach Shores Disaster Access Pass. They do not expire and can be obtained at DB Shores office.
- Buy pool noodles for your sliding glass doors.
- Assemble a first aid kit
- Buy a can opener that doesn't require electricity
- Ready your cell phone with Apps. News App for <u>iOS</u> | <u>Android</u>
- Have an evacuation plan in place that includes pets
- Enable emergency alerts on your cell phone



KNOW WHAT TO DO WHEN A TROPICAL STORM OR HURRICANE WATCH IS ISSUED

Stay tuned to local news stations or the Weather Channel for updates.

- Bring inside any lawn furniture, outdoor decorations or ornaments, plants, and anything else that can be picked up by the wind.
- Watch hurricane forecast models
- Place pool noodles in sliding glass door tracks. If you don't have newer windows and sliding glass doors, you can add rolled towels or adult disposable diapers around sliding doors, and heavy plastic over vulnerable windows.
- Make sure you have at least two weeks of all prescription meds and sufficient OTC meds
- Fill bathtub with water
- Fill your car with gas and get sufficient cash in case you need to evacuate

WHAT TO DO WHEN A TROPICAL STORM OR HURRICANE WARNING IS ISSUED

- Listen to the advice of local officials. If you are advised to evacuate, leave. If you decide to stay, you may not have access to emergency services (police, ambulance, etc.). The bridges close when the wind speed reaches 39 mph.
- If you are not advised to evacuate, stay indoors, away from windows.
- If you stay, do not go outside your condo unless it is safe.
- Be alert for tornadoes. Tornadoes can happen during a hurricane and after it passes over. Remain indoors, in the center of your home, in a closet or bathroom without windows.



OTHER SUGGESTIONS

- Have surge protectors and battery backups for electronics
- Let friends, family, and neighbors know your plan and how to reach you if you evacuate
